Doosan Forklift Parts - Doosan Infracore Company Ltd. is an intercontinental company consisting of Diesel Engines, Defense Industry goods, Industrial Vehicles, Construction Equipment and Machine Instruments and Automation Systems.

In the United States, Doosan Infracore America Corporation is headquartered in Suwanee, Georgia. It is home to a 170,000 square foot production facility, which is the home of the Compact Equipment and Construction division. West Caldwell, New Jersey is home to the Machine Tool division and Cleveland, Abilene is home to the Lift truck division. The U.S. headquarters in Georgia facilitates a first rate parts operation capable of supplying an excess of 25,000 line items to support Lift Truck, Compact Equipment, Machine Tool and Construction consumer requirements.

With a network consisting of over 90 independent sellers, the forklift group provides quality materials handling equipment to the broad North American market. Doosan Infracore America Lift Truck sellers successfully operate in over 220 service and sales locations throughout Canada and the U.S. The forklift product line remarkably comprises of 63 distinctive models consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion forklifts. Capacities of these numerous truck designs range from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All vehicles are designed in an ISO 9001 certified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest growing forklift business in the North American marketplace, thanks to their stability in retaining a high degree of client service excellence and optimum product performance to all Doosan Infracore Forklift users. The U.S. forklift division stationed in Cleveland has a professional team knowledgeable in Product Sales, Purchasing, Marketing, Logistical and Technical Support.

Korea's initial domestic lift truck marketplace was an open-import enterprise. In the 1960's, Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. started to import assembled lift trucks as part of a nationwide equipment expansion venture. Initial product sales of this industrial equipment focused on large business groups, the armed forces and on state-run corporations. This ultimately led to a merger with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division begun trade operations throughout Korea to overhaul and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a forklift production plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical training grew to become the new focus for enhancing quality and product development.

Home-based forklift business for Daewoo started in 1967 and grew to an astonishing 90% market share in Korea. By the 1980's, Daewoo's progressive technological improvements combined with sales success placed them in a position of considerable expansion of their lift truck business.

In 1981, Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the United States, proposed a cooperative venture project to respond to competitive pressures in the US materials handling industry. This endeavor greatly expanded Daewoo's forklift sales. Construction was finished in 1984 to facilitate a modern plant which helped set up the company for the fabrication of high end added-value goods suitable for export. In 1993, the corporation had a global sales network and started exporting designs they had established through in-house expertise, as an independent brand. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing expansion possibilities into overseas markets.
